Conditions of entry change frequently so you need to check the page frequently.

Once in France:


There is no obligation to wear the mask outdoors but it is mandatory in all public indoor spaces. No curfew.

Stay 2 meters apart from persons presenting symptoms.



Personal computer equipment

ESIEA students (regardless of the year of study or the site and including work-study students) must bring a laptop computer.



This personal laptop is an essential work tool for the smooth running of studies.

It allows each student to work with standard scientific and office software, recommended or supplied by ESIEA, to connect to the network and use the resources made available by the IT department.

In all cases, wifi n / ac is necessary as well as a USB output and a network port, via a USB-C or Tthunderbolt adapter if necessary.

A 15 " screen and a large battery provide more user comfort. However, be careful with the total weight because you will be asked to use it very regularly on campus.

If you do not have a laptop available, we advise you to wait until the beginning of the school year to benefit from special offers regularly offered by KPS, the computer association of the lvry campus, and the Info Center of ESIEA or, for Laval students, the RC-Lab association.

Students will benefit from Mathematica software as well as the Office Suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, Outlook, Lync, Publisher, Access).

r — Documents to bring to France

- > Passport
- > A copy of your birth certificate
- Student card from your home institution
- All proof of insurances (health, housing, VISALE certificate, etc.)
- Proof of vaccination or negative PCR test (check with your airline)

The first steps when arriving in France

- If you are a degree-seeking student, pay the CVEC (Student and Campus Life Contribution) and obtain a certificate. 92€ for the year 2020-2021. More information <u>here</u>.
- > Finalise the administrative registration at ESIEA and get the student card
- > Register for French social security. More information <u>here</u>.
- Validate your residence permit. Cost 50 €. This process is done online. More information <u>here</u>.
- Open a bank account. Required documents: ID card or passport, proof of address and student card.
- > Open a telephone and internet line.



ESIEA cooperates with the CROUS, a public organization that manages student halls of residence, and has reserved a limited quota of furnished CROUS rooms.

Reservations for CROUS Accommodation should be done through ESIEA's International Office. Exchange students cannot apply directly. If you wish ESIEA to make reservations for you, please inform us no later than 6 weeks prior to arrival.

The available rooms are on a first-come, first-served basis, in the order the applications arrive. Due to the limited number of exchange student rooms, please note that applying before the deadline does not guarantee housing at CROUS. The assignment of your accomodation will be according to availability

There is a University restaurant nearby open from 7:30 to 20:45 from Monday to Friday. A full meal at a university restaurant costs 3,25 euros.

How to check-in at Cachan & K-B

First, you have to notify your arrival date, and then the CROUS will send you a notification by e-mail confirming the date and time that you will have to arrive at the residence.

Bedding not provided

Students must bring or buy pillows, blankets, sheets and pillowcases

Rent: between 263 \in and 430 \in / month for a room, utilities included.

Deposit: 233 € (this will be returned if the room is in good condition at the end of the student's stay)

15 minutes metro ride ESIEA Ivry Campus - Residence hall CROUS

Rent: 400-450 \in / month for a room, utilities included.

Deposit: 233 € (this will be returned if the room is in good condition at the end of the student's stay)



In France, students need a guarantor to rent a flat or a room in a student hall of residence. The best thing to do is to have the Visale rental deposit assistance.

First possibility:

Monthly payment if you have the Visale rental deposit assistance.

The deposit and the rent for the first month must be paid by credit on the day of your arrival to the residence.

VISALE Rental deposit assistance - Visale

The Visale guarantee, a service from Action Logement, offers adult students a free rental deposit for any type of accommodation.

Visale acts as guarantor for your landlord, a simple solution accessible in a few clicks.

 - Identity card or Passport and visa if applicable
 - The ESIEA enrolment certificate

Second possibility:

If you do not have a guarantor, you will have to **pay by credit card the total amount of your stay + 233 € deposit** on the day of your arrival to the residence.




Documents to provide upon arrival:

(Please make photocopies before arriving, just in case)

- CROUS application form (we'll send It to you by email)
- 2 identity photos
- 1 copy of your passport
- 1 copy of the ESIEA enrolment certificate
- VISALE 'visa' (distinct from the visa granted by the consulate), see information above
- Certificate proving housing insurance (see Insurance section)
- Your full bank details

This information is needed to get your deposit reimbursed. Please complete and print the document "Bank Account Details" that the International Office will send you.



All students must show proof of French housing insurance upon arrival to cover accidental damage caused by the tenant or by natural disasters: flooding, storm etc...

They also have to take out civil liability insurance which covers them in case of damage to a third person. This is generally included in the housing insurance, but this needs to be verified.

To take out a housing insurance policy, you can use any on-line provider, but you must use a French insurance company. CROUS recommands this one :

> <u>ADH Assurance</u>, Student accommodation insurance, you need Formula 2 or 3.

The students will need to pay for 1 year of insurance (regardless of the length of stay)

> Other French companies like **HEYME** or **SMEBA** also offer such insurance policies.

Important: You should make sure that you have the civil liability coverage

Student Housing aid

CAF (Personalised Housing Aid (Aide personalisée au logement - APL)

Apply for housing aid online here

- > You need a French bank account in order to apply.
- > You will also need to provide the following documents:
 - 1. Your housing agreement
 - 2. Your full bank details (Relevé d'identité bancaire: RIB)
 - 3. A proof of your total income in 2019
 - 4. The proof of address form filled out by your lessor, if this is requested at the end of your application.

5. You will need to submit proof of identity (your national ID card or passport and your birth certificate),

- If you are an EU citizen, you will need to submit proof of school enrolment and a copy of your European Health Insurance Card,
- If you are not an EU citizen, you will need to submit a copy of your valid residence permit ("titre de séjour").

If you need to provide documentary evidence, the list of required documents will appear on the last page of your online application.

Paris and its surroundings

If you are under 26 and a student, you can get the **Carte Imagine R** card, valid for one year, for travel in the entire Paris Region (Île-de-France).

The Imagine R annual card costs €342, payable once or over 9 instalments, without any additional fees, +€8 administration fee.

To subscribe, pick up an application from a RATP station or apply online.

There are five start dates for the pass:
 1 September, 1 October, 1 November, 1 December or 1 January.

Laval and its surroundings

If you are under 26 and a student, you can get an Annual Abonnement Jeune on a TUL card for travel in Laval and its surroundings.

The Annual Abonnement costs 128€, payable once or over several instalments. To subscribe, pick up an application from a TUL station or apply online.

How to arrive to to ESIEA lvry-sur-Seine campus by metro



- Metro station : Pierre et Marie Curie
- Direction : Mairie d'Ivry line 7
- Exit : 2. Avenue Maurice Thorez

Warning :

This line has two destinations : Mairie d'Ivry, identified in yellow, and Villejuif Louis Aragon, identified in blue.

When you are on the platform waiting for the metro, you must ensure that you take the correct destination, Mairie d'Ivry, indicated:

- on the illuminated sign on the platform,
- on each car by yellow-lit signs.

Once you are on the train, the destination is announced by voice at the station before the junction.





There are many places in Paris and its surroundings you can visit as you please! You can check the <u>Paris Tourist Office website</u> to learn more about the city.

Here are some tips:

- Many museums are free for those under 26 such as the Louvre, l'Orangerie, Pompidou Center, quai Branly, Orsay, or the Arts et Métiers (don't forget your ID!)
- Street art can be seen on various districts like the 4th in the center of Paris, 13th, 11th, 19th, 20th, like a life-size exhibition!
- > You can find some gaming bars in the center like the Reset bar or Le Dernier Bar avant la Fin du Monde at Châtelet
- > The biggest parks of Paris are the Buttes-Chaumont (19th), Montsouris (13th) and Luxembourg (5th)
- > There are castles accessible with the public transports like the castle of Versailles, Fontainebleau, Monte-Cristo, or Rambouillet (45 min to 2h of travel)


